Key Facts

- 13 schools received Full Inspections in 2023.
- Three government schools were judged as 'good', maintaining their level of quality from previous inspections.
- One private school maintained its 'excellent' judgement; another private school improved from 'satisfactory' to 'good', while another had a decline in judgement from 'good' to 'satisfactory'. One private school that was inspected for the first time was judged as 'good'. One private school that was repeatedly

judged 'weak' improved to 'satisfactory'. The remaining schools maintained their previous ratings. No schools were judged 'weak' during the 2023 Full Inspections.

- A total of 4,772 students were enrolled at those schools that received Full Inspections during the 2023 inspection period.
- 73% (3,500) of the total students enrolled were Caymanian.
- 62% of the total students enrolled attended 'good' or 'excellent' schools.
- Only 54% of schools inspected in 2023 were performing at the expected level of 'good' or better.
- 38% of the total students enrolled, including 1,436 Caymanian students, attended schools that were judged to be not yet meeting the expected level of 'good' performance according to the OES *Successful Schools and Achieving Students 2* criteria.
- 59% of Caymanian students enrolled at schools inspected in 2023 attended schools that were judged to be 'good' or better.

Key Facts

- Three schools received Follow-Through Inspections. Of these, two schools were found to have made satisfactory progress towards their recommendations and one was judged to be making weak progress.
- One school had declined from 'good' to 'weak' between two previous inspection cycles and in the 2023 Follow-Through Inspection was judged to have made satisfactory progress towards meeting the recommendations in their previous report.
- A total of 430 children were enrolled across the three schools which received Follow-Through Inspections. Of these, 25% (12% Caymanian) were enrolled in the school found to be making weak progress.

Key Facts

- 10 early childhood centres received Full Inspections in 2023.
- Five of the early childhood centres received a ‘good’ judgement, with one of these receiving an improved judgement over their previous “weak” judgement and two receiving an improved judgement over their previous ‘satisfactory’ judgement. Two others retained their previous judgement.
- One centre that was inspected for the first time received a ‘satisfactory’ judgement.
- Three centres were judged as ‘satisfactory’. Two centres were judged as ‘weak’, representing a decline from their previous ‘satisfactory’ judgements.

- A total of 529 children were enrolled at those early childhood centres receiving Full Inspections during the 2023 inspection period.
- 55% (289) of the total number of children enrolled were Caymanian.
- 57% of the total children enrolled attended centres judged as 'good', with 54% of them being Caymanian.
- Only 50% of centres inspected in 2023 were performing at the expected level of 'good'.
- 43% of the total number of children enrolled, including 127 Caymanian children, attended early childhood centres that were judged to be not yet meeting the expected level of 'good' performance.
